## Accelerated Data Program

### Objective

#### Support developing countries in :

- producing statistics for policy design, monitoring and evaluation
- making better use of existing data
- aligning survey programs and statistical outputs to priority data needs

> focuses on household surveys / censuses

> takes advantage of the tools and guidelines of the International Household Survey Network (IHSN)

### Supported activities

#### ADP activities are country-based and are broken into three tasks:

- Task 1: Inventory, documentation and dissemination of existing micro-data
- Task 2: Assessment and analysis of existing data, and improvement of national survey programs
- Task 3: Support to data collection

> ADP provides specialized training, technical assistance, acquisition of software and hardware.

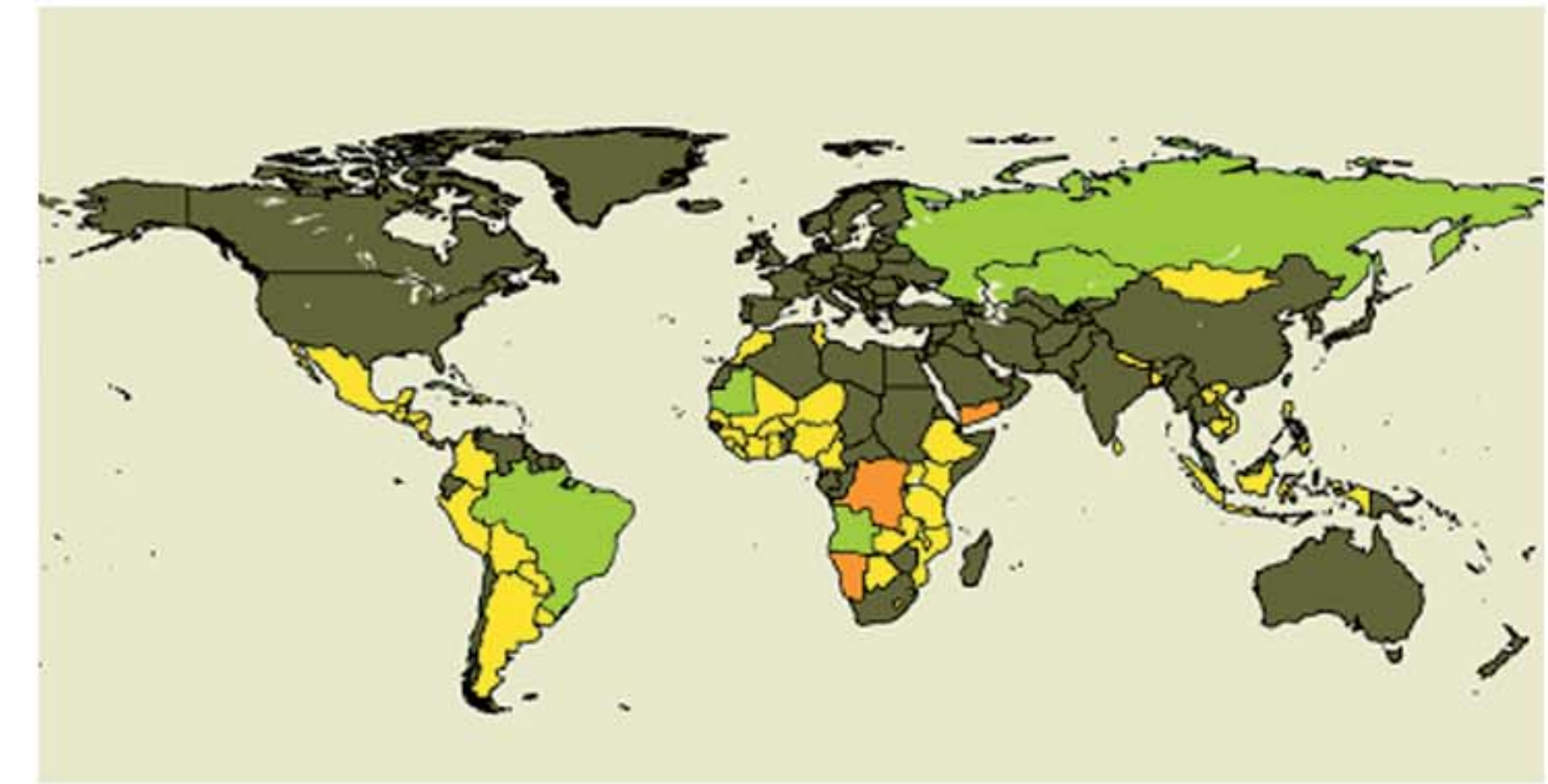
> ADP supports regional communities of practice in microdata management.

### Results

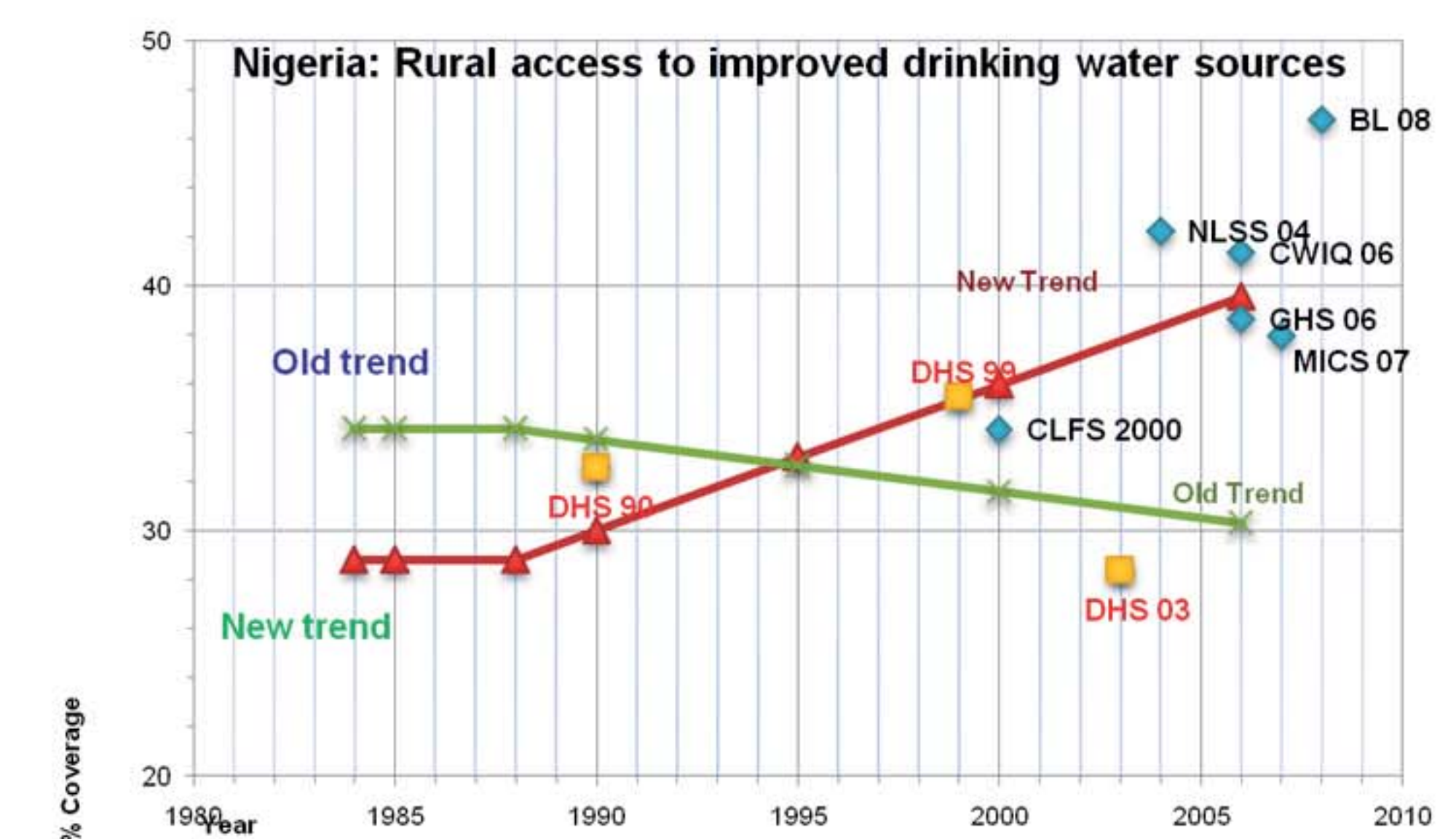
- Capacity in microdata management built in more than 80 national institutions in 50 countries
- National Data Archives accessible to the public in 15 countries, 20 by end of 2009
- 1,000 surveys documented, some of them made accessible to the public (including microdatasets)
- Improved access to microdata through the design and adoption of national dissemination policies
- Increased value of documented and accessible data
- Past surveys assessed to increase the quality of future surveys
- Key indicators (re)calculated on the basis of all existing datasets
