# PARIS 21!

ADAPT is PARIS21'S free, cloud-based, multilingual consultative data planning tool for national statistical offices (NSOs) and other data producers to adapt their data production to the priority data needs of policymakers. ADAPT is currently being used by over 20 countries, including for gender-specific data planning.



## WHAT IS THE ADAPT GENDER MODULE?

The ADAPT Gender Module allows the monitoring of the production of data for gender statistics that more accurately describe the situation of women and men in society according to relevant global commitments and national policies.



## WHAT DOES THE ADAPT GENDER MODULE DO?

ADAPT allows users to tag indicators as gender-relevant according to national and global priorities. It also produces the following reports:

**Across-policies:** Takes into account all indicators that are sex-disaggregated or have been tagged as gender-relevant in national and global policies

**SDG gender-specific indicators:** 54 indicators identified by UN Women

**Minimum Set of Gender Indicators:** 52 fundamental indicators determined by the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on Gender Statistics (IAEG-GS)



## WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF USING THE ADAPT GENDER MODULE?

- Allows you to see all gender-related data being produced across the different agencies in the national statistical system.
- Maps gender statistics demand from global and national policies to identify consistency, alignment, and possible overlaps.
- Provides a detailed look into data gaps to monitor the SDGs and other policies relevant to gender equality.



## MALDIVES

Maldives made strides in gender equality over the past decade, but there remain gender gaps in economic development, opportunity and access to certain institutions. To address these, the Government of Maldives is working with PARIS21 to better incorporate gender-specific indicators in its national strategy for the development of statistics (NSDS).

In August 2019, PARIS21 hosted an ADAPT workshop for gender statistics data planning in Malé, Maldives. The workshop brought together around 20 statisticians representing main stakeholders of the national statistical system in charge of developing gender-specific indicators. At the end of the training, the participants were awarded certificates by Her Excellency Shidhatha Shareef, Minister of Gender, Family and Social Services. This exercise was one of the main activities aimed at the preparation of a gender statistics assessment in Maldives, which will in turn provide a basis for a gender statistics strategy in the Maldives NSDS.
